## CELEBRATING SPECIAL EVENTS DURING COVID-19

Consider these reasons to postpone special events during this time.



### SPECIAL EVENTS = PERSON TO PERSON CONTACT.

Spread of the virus happens most frequently with close contacts. By hosting or attending a gathering, you're increasing everyone's risk of getting infected.



### YOU'RE PUTTING LOVED ONES AT RISK!

Your grandparents and family members with underlying health conditions are at a higher risk of contracting COVID-19. It's your responsibility to protect those at high risk.



### BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY.

People who look healthy still can be infected and can spread the virus to you and your household. That's why it's important to stay away from those outside your household, even if they don't seem sick.



### HOUSEHOLD MEANS ONLY THOSE YOU LIVE WITH.

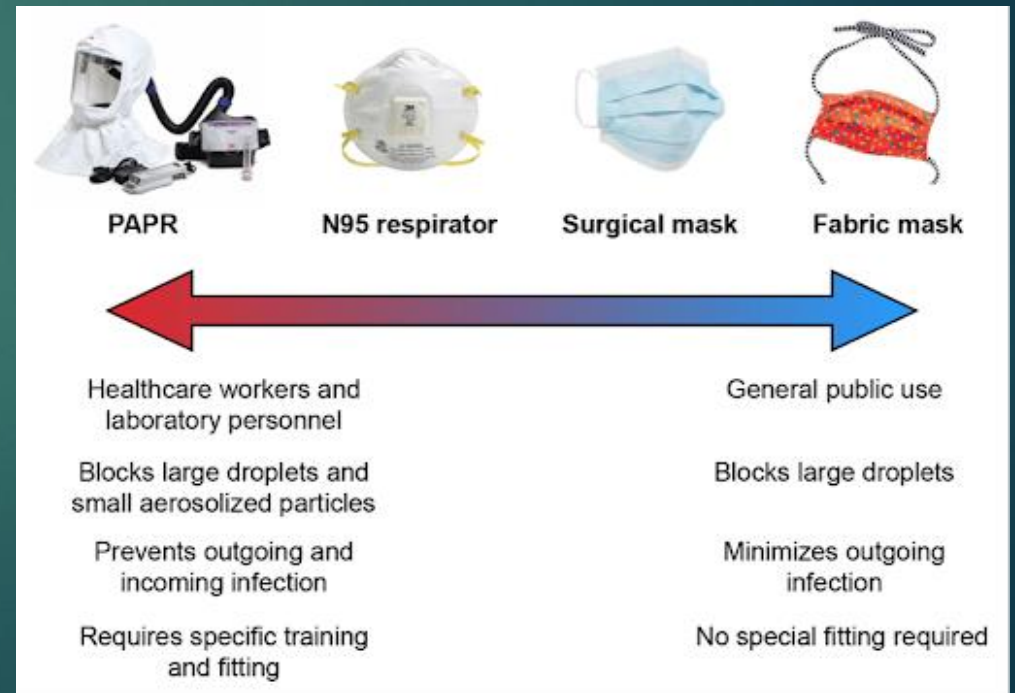
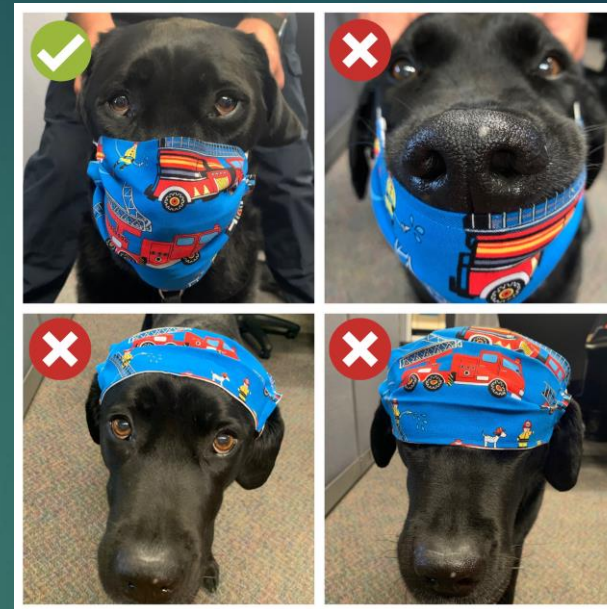
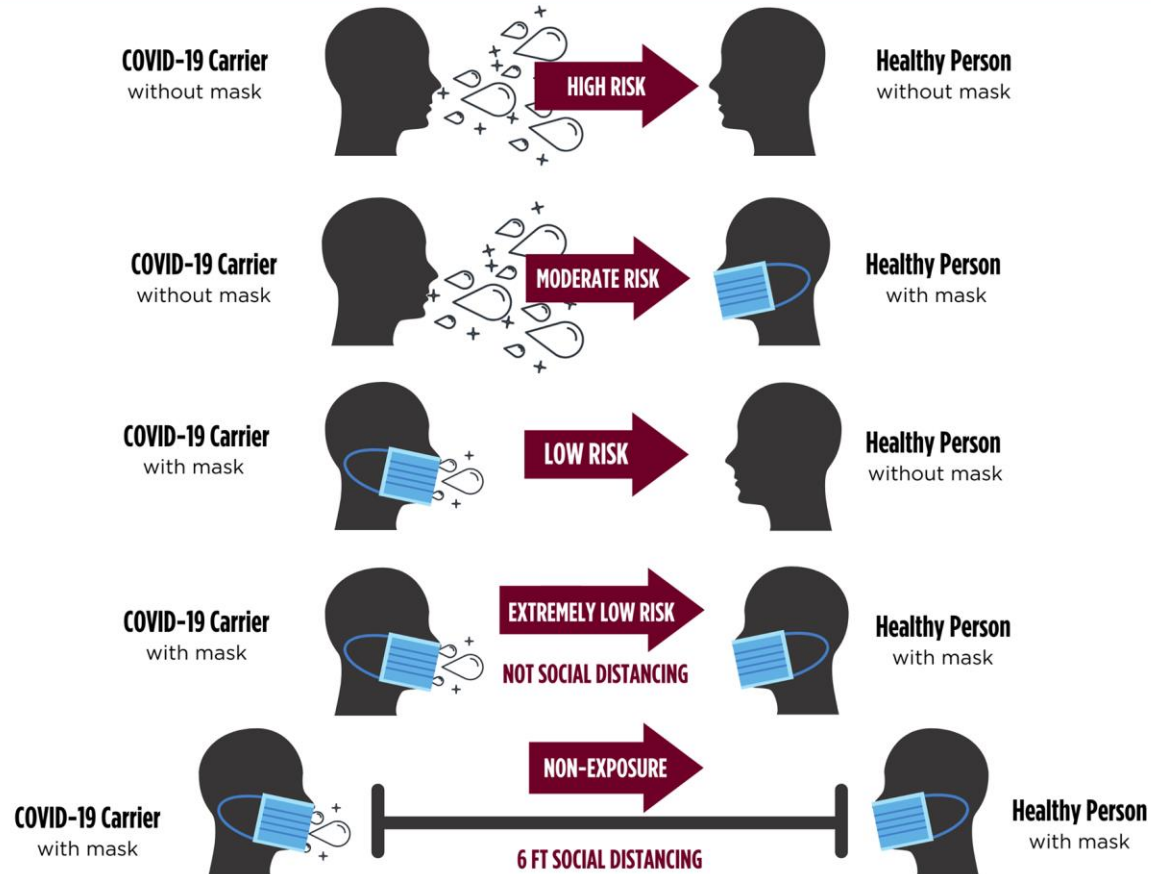
Gatherings are limited to ONLY those you live with. Extended family or guests should not be allowed over for any occasion.

# Are Masks Required?

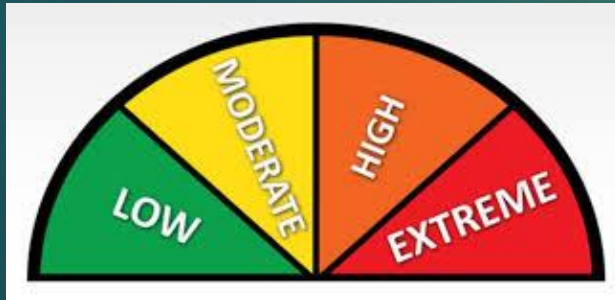
## Depends on where and who

- ▶ All First Responders
- ▶ Barbers and Hair Stylists and their customers
- ▶ Generally employees who cannot maintain 6 feet of distance from each other or customers
- ▶ Cities or Counties with Requirements (City of Fresno, LA, SF, San Diego)
- ▶ Any business that makes it a requirement
- ▶ Some government facilities
  
- ▶ **Why:** Risk levels vary by business, region and personal needs due to a variety of factors including health sensitivity and exposure frequency.

# Four Stage Plan

City of Selma, County of Fresno,  
all cities in the County of Fresno  
are all in:

## Late Stage 2 (stage 2.5)



### Stage 2: Lower-risk workplaces

Gradually opening some lower risk workplaces with adaptations at a pace designed to protect public health and safety, starting with:

- Retail
- Manufacturing
- Offices (when telework not possible)
- Outdoor Museums
- Limited Personal Services

Limit time outside the home and travel only for permissible activities, such as healthcare, food, outdoor exercise and recreation (individuals and households only). Stage 1 and 2 work, and local shopping or other activities related to open sectors.

Some counties may move more quickly through stage 2, following guidelines laid out on the [county variance page](#).

Other counties may maintain more restrictive public health measures.

Monitor critical indicators and alter scope of reopening if necessary to protect public health and safety.

# What is Open

- ✓ Schools and School Based Programs
- ✓ Day Camps and Campgrounds
- ✓ Restaurants & Retail
- ✓ Bars / Wineries
- ✓ Places of Worship \*25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is smaller
- ✓ Gyms \*no playgrounds, team contact sports
- ✓ Pools \*attestation form may be required
- ✓ Parks (limited uses and varies city to city)
- ✓ Hair Salons/Barbers \*masks required, no nails, eyelashes, facials, massage
- ✓ Hotels \*no banquet halls, conventions etc.
- ✓ Zoos and Museums
- ✓ Cardrooms/Racetracks \*no spectators

**Required to submit form to county**  
Recently allowed to open

# What is not Open

The following sectors, businesses, establishments, or activities are **not permitted** to operate in **FRESNO COUNTY** at this time:

- ▶ **Movie Theaters (June 26<sup>th</sup>)**
- ▶ **Family Entertainment Centers (June 26<sup>th</sup>)**
- ▶ Nail salons and other close contact beauty services
- ▶ tattoo parlors
- ▶ Private parties at bars/restaurants etc.
- ▶ Nightclubs
- ▶ Concert venues/ Theater performances
- ▶ Live audience sports
- ▶ Festivals
- ▶ Theme parks

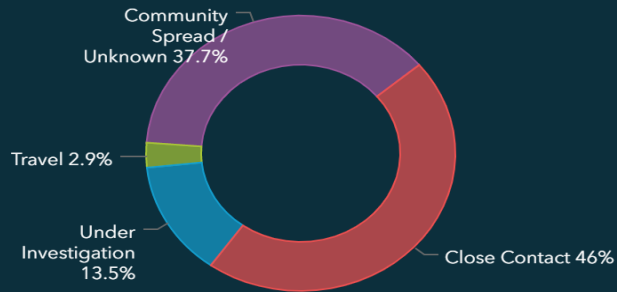

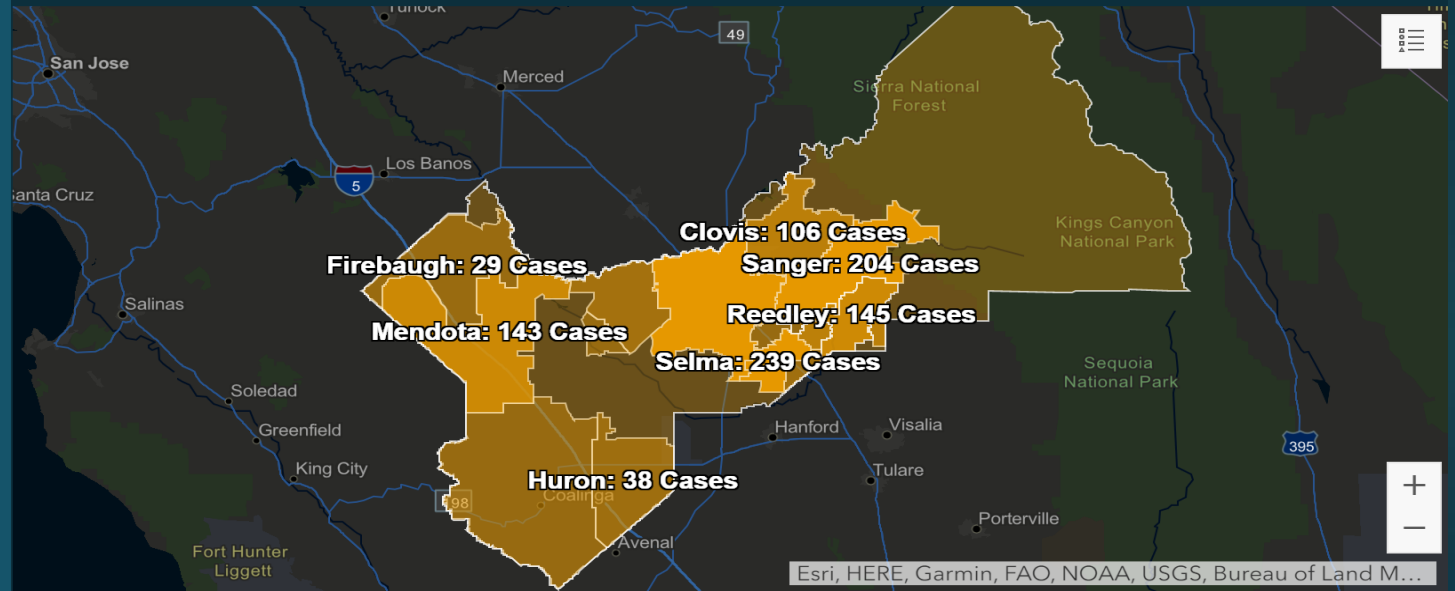

Consider these reasons to postpone special events during this time:

**COVID-19 INDUSTRY GUIDANCE:**  
Restaurants, Bars, and Wineries  
Release date: June 5, 2020  
Recommended effective date no sooner than: June 12, 2020  
All guidance should be implemented only with county health officer approval following their review of local epidemiological data including cases per 100,000 population, rate of test positivity, and local preparedness to support a health care surge, vulnerable populations, contact tracing, and testing.

# Reopening Selma

- ▶ City Hall - Partially Open: Evaluating City Hall for further modifications
- ▶ Senior Center – Closed: Meals moved to M/W/F delivery (still 5 meals for the week)
- ▶ Pioneer Village – Closed: but one museum building may open
- ▶ Park Amenities Planned to Reopen
  - ▶ Parking lots
  - ▶ Pickle-ball
  - ▶ Tennis
  - ▶ Skate Park
- ▶ What is not opening
  - ▶ Basketball courts
  - ▶ Restrooms
  - ▶ Playground equipment
  - ▶ **Why:** State/County guidance on recreation includes no-contact sports and the City's ability to disinfect and monitor use

## Selma PD arrest six individuals for DUI after alcoholic establishments re-open

Between the dates of June 11 to June 14, 2020, six individuals were arrested for driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.

Local alcoholic establishments have recently opened up after being closed for two months due to the Covid-19 pandemic restrictions. Since the restrictions have been lifted, the Selma Police Department has seen a recent increase in DUI arrests.

The Selma Police Department would like to remind the community that driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs is dangerous and is a serious crime.

Drivers charged with DUI could face up to one year in jail, suspended driver's license and pay fines up to \$10,000.

The individuals who were recently arrested for DUI are identified as Anthony Pruneda, 37 years old of Parlier, Stephanie Alvarado, 35 years old of Selma, Sergio Mendoza, 25 years old of Selma, Susanna Olivares, 34 years old of Selma, Pablo Trejo, 60 years old of Selma and Joanna Ramirez, 26 years old of Orosi.

- **Selma PD arrest gang member for being in possession of two handguns**

On 06/13/20, at approximately 11:14 P.M., a Selma Police Officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop on a vehicle in the area of the 1200 block of Second Street in the city of Selma for a traffic violation. The driver who was identified as Jesus Acevedo did not have a valid driver's license. There was also a front passenger who was identified as Luis Avendano.

During the investigation, officers observed an open alcoholic container and an open container of marijuana in plain view inside of the vehicle. During a search of the vehicle, officers located a loaded 9 mm Ruger and a 40 mm Glock-22 inside of the vehicle. A further search also revealed a drug paraphernalia pipe, which is used to smoke and ingest methamphetamine.

Jesus Acevedo, 29 years old of Parlier was arrested for being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm/ammunition, possession of two high capacity magazines, drug paraphernalia and committing a felony while out on bail. Acevedo has an extensive dangerous criminal record.

Luis Avendano, 20 years old of Kingsburg, was also arrested for being in possession of a methamphetamine pipe on his person.

Both Acevedo and Avendano were transported to the Fresno County Jail for booking.
